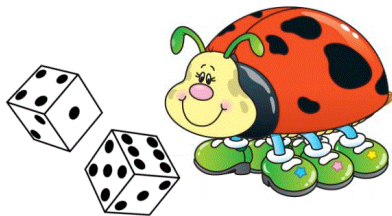

And finally: One the day of our baptism, each one of us, through the gratuitous gift of God, received in our souls the seed of faith.
