And finally: "Here I am, since you called me." The third chapter of the first book of Samuel begins '... And the word of the Lord was rare in those days; there was no frequent visions.' I suspect that there are many who would agree; many who would say that this statement is as true and relevant today as it was in the time of Eli and Samuel. I wonder however, is this really the case, or is the real truth that the Lord does call to us each and every day and we simply do not listen? Then, of course, there are those who are listening for the voice of the Lord, but when they hear it they are too afraid to respond, or are unwilling to accept the demands that that call might entail. Have you ever thought what our world, or life, would be like if Andrew had not heard the voice of the Lord; or if Simon Peter had been too afraid to accept the invitation "Come and see"? The truth is that each and every one of us has been, and continues to be, called by the Lord into his service; that we all have a vocation which is as unique to us as we are as individuals in the sight of God himself. Like Samuel, Andrew, and Simon, if we are to answer our call, to come to know what our true vocation is, we must first make time to listen for the voice of the Lord. We must pray each day, asking the Lord to make his will known to us – to say with Samuel "Speak Lord, your servant is listening". Then, having listened and heard, we must pray for wisdom needed to discern what that call means; pray for the courage to respond to that call, no matter the cost; and pray for the strength to follow, each and every day, the path that the Lord has set us upon. Great things happened when Andrew and Peter answered their call! What more great things might happen, I wonder, if we all answered ours?
