**And finally:** On Tuesday, as we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, Sacred Scripture affords us the opportunity of looking at how faith impacts our daily living. On this day we encounter in the Gospel two figures, Simeon and Anna. These two figures share many things in common; both are well on in years, both are people of great faith, both are people who have an absolute confidence that the promise of the Lord would be fulfilled in their own time. At the exact moment that the Christ child is brought into the Temple, Simeon prompted by the Holy Spirit, and Anna who spent her days in fasting and prayer, enter in and witness the scene by which their hopes and desires were fulfilled. Like them, we too should daily, in faith and in trust, commit our lives, our work and our selves to the Lord, confident that His promises will be fulfilled. Perhaps this year, living in these strange and uncertain times as we are, we can look to these two great figures of scripture for inspiration. They teach us the lessons of hope and trust in God, and in His power to fulfil His promises. With them may we entrust ourselves to God's care, confident that He hears our prayer. With them may we truly believe that all things are in God's hands, and that with God on our side we have nothing to fear, for He is always with us to guard, guide and direct our lives, until His purposes have been fulfilled
