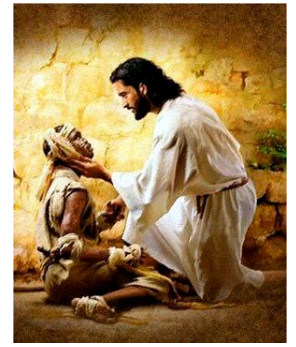

Reclaim our Common Home

CAFOD has launched a new campaign ‘Reclaim our Common Home’ in response to an urging from Pope Francis. “This summer Britain will be hosting the G7 annual meeting where leaders of the world’s most powerful countries will discuss how to rebuild from the pandemic. And in November Britain will be hosting the UN COP26 climate talks, where world leaders will come together to agree on how to prevent catastrophic climate change. As host of these two key summits, the British Government will have significant leverage over these negotiations. We, as citizens, can influence our government. The world is at a crossroad and this opportunity for transformation cannot be missed.”

Organ Restoration Fund

The church organ here at St. Mary of the Angels is in need of some urgent repair work. Many of the electrical components of the organ have now begun to fail, due to their age and general wear and tear, and need to be replaced. As we are currently not using the organ on a regular basis now would be the perfect time to address these issues and so bring the organ back up to perfect working order. The cost of the works needed is £5,824.80. If you would like to make a donation towards the cost of the repair work it would be greatly appreciated. ASH WEDNESDAY



This Wednesday, 17th February, is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent. Masses will be celebrated at 9.15am & 7.30pm. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the ongoing restrictions under which we operate, things this year will be a little different. As with the distribution of Holy Communion, following the homily and the blessing of the Ashes, the priest will then say the acclamation ‘Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return’ once. The congregation then comes forward to receive the Ashes in the normal manner, however, instead of making the sign of the Cross on your forehead, the ash will be sprinkled on the crown of your head, and this will be done in silence. Ash Wednesday is observed by the whole Church as a day of penance, a day of both Fasting and Abstinence.

And finally: This weekend we stand on the verge of the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent. This season, as we all know, is marked by three very clear characteristics; it is a season of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. In the gospel of this Sunday, the encounter between Our Lord and the Leper, gives us an opportunity to reflect upon one of those characteristics – prayer – and our attitude towards it. The first thing to notice is the way in which the Leper approaches the Lord. He does not say 'If you can', instead he says 'If you want to'. Here the Leper is demonstrating his faith, his utter belief that the Lord can heal him, all he need do is ask the question – in other words, to pray. We too should approach the Lord in prayer with this same attitude, with a real belief that Christ can do all things, that he can answer our prayers if we ask of Him in faith. Our Lord's response 'Of course I want to' shows that Our Lord is waiting for us to pray, waiting for us to bring our needs before Him. It shows that He desires to bring healing and wholeness to our lives, if only we have the faith to ask. Yet the ending to the gospel passage brings our attention to an important point of faith. Christ orders the Leper 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest'. The Lord does not want people to come to Him in prayer simply because He can do something for them; to believe in Him simply because He is a worker of miracles. His true desire, the true purpose of His coming is that we may have life in Him, that we may have faith in Him who has power over sin and death. May this Lent bring about in us a deepening of faith; a renewed attitude in prayer, and a true spirit of thanksgiving in our hearts for the mystery of God's love for us revealed in Christ.
