### **Pope Francis:**

During the Season of Lent, the Holy Spirit drives us too, like Jesus, into the desert (MK 1:12-15). It is not a physical place, but rather an existential dimension in which we can be silent and listen to the word of God, so that a true conversion might be effected in us.

### **Data Protection – Live-streaming**

Sunday 9.30am Mass, and all weekday Masses will continue to be live-streamed for those who at this time cannot be with us in church. The camera is situated at the front of the church so that only the Sanctuary is visible. If, however, you are sitting on the right side of the church you will become visible, in a way in which you might be recognisable, for a brief moment as you return from receiving Holy Communion. If you do not wish to appear on the live-stream please inform one of the stewards who will ensure that you are seated on the left of the church.

### **Stations of the Cross**

On Fridays at 3.30pm, during the Season of Lent, we meditate upon the mystery of the Lord's Passion in the Stations of the Cross. For those joining us via the live-stream, and who may be unfamiliar with this devotion, here are the two prayers, which will help you participate more fully.

#### **Before each station:**

**V:** We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you.

**R:** Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

#### **After each Station:**

I love you, Jesus, my love above all things, and I am heartily sorry for having offended you. Never let me separate myself from you again. Grant that I may love you always, and then do with me what you will. Amen.

### **Pope's Prayer Intention**

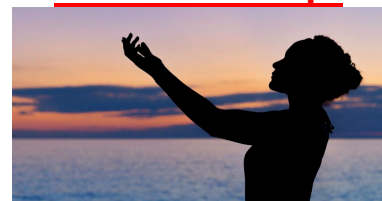

The church organ here at St. Mary of the Angels is in need of some urgent repair work. Many of the electrical components of the organ have now begun to fail, due to their age and general wear and tear, and need to be replaced. As we are currently not using the organ on a regular basis now would be the perfect time to address these issues and so bring the organ back up to perfect working order. The cost of the works needed is **£5,824.80**. If you would like to make a donation towards the cost of the repair work it would be greatly appreciated.
