

### Data Protection – Live-streaming

If, however, you are sitting on the right side of the church you will become visible, in a way in which you might be recognisable, for a brief moment as you return from receiving Holy Communion. If you do not wish to appear on the live-stream please inform one of the stewards who will ensure that you are seated on the left of the church.

### Stations of the Cross

#### Before each station:

**V:** We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you.

**R:** Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

#### After each Station:

I love you, Jesus, my love above all things, and I am heartily sorry for having offended you. Never let me separate myself from you again. Grant that I may love you always, and then do with me what you will. Amen.

Many of the electrical components of the organ have now begun to fail, due to their age and general wear and tear, and need to be replaced. As we are currently not using the organ on a regular basis now would be the perfect time to address these issues and so bring the organ back up to perfect working order. ## The Sacred Easter Triduum

The Easter Triduum this year, as you would expect given the current circumstances, is going to be a little different to what we are used to. However, it is wonderful that this year we can be present in church for some, or all of the ceremonies. On Monday there will be a page on the Parish Website called “Easter Triduum”. On this page you will find all of the information about the services, their times, and the differences to the ceremonial. Here you will also find the ‘Booking-in Forms’ for each of the services. For each of the services I will work on a ‘first come, first served’

principle. Once each of the services has reached the maximum capacity of the church the ‘Booking-in Form’ pertaining to that service will be removed from the website. This year it is permissible for the Liturgy of the Passion (Good Friday) to be repeated if necessary. Therefore, if necessary, this service will be repeated at 6.30pm, and the booking in form will change to reflect this need.
