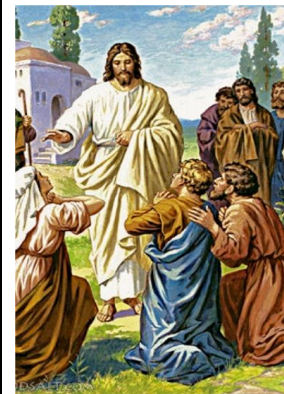

### Sacrament of the Sick

Please remember to inform Fr. Craig **directly** in case of sickness, especially if it requires hospital treatment or a prolonged absence from Mass. If you cannot inform the clergy yourself it is then your family who should take on this responsibility.

**And finally:-** In a few weeks time, on the First Sunday of Advent, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and all Holy Days of Obligation will be reinstated after its suspension at the beginning of the COVID pandemic. Over the next few weeks we have the opportunity to reflect upon the importance of keeping the Lord’s Day holy, on our coming together as a community of faith in thanksgiving to God for the wonder of His love revealed in the sacrifice of Christ. There are still many of our parishioners who have as yet not returned to Sunday Mass, and I am sure that each of us know of parishioners who, for one reason or another, may have fallen away from the practice of their faith. Coming together for the celebration of Mass is not simply an opportunity to give thanks to God for the gift of Christ and the Eucharist, it is also a time when we enter into communion with each other – a communion which supports us and sustains us in our daily living. Within the community of faith each and everyone of us is an important and integral part, each and everyone of us has something to offer to the Lord and to the community itself. As Advent approaches I pray that the Lord will give us the strength necessary to encourage each other in our faith, drawing us together into His Body the Church, building us up in love and fellowship by the peace which binds us together.
