Beware of Spam Emails

The Archdiocese has been made aware of spam emails coming from fraudulent impersonated Gmail accounts pretending to be from Parish Priests. These emails often include 'parishpastor' and the name of the parish priest, but they are not being sent from priests' email accounts. Protective action has been taken by the Diocesan IT team to block such emails but they can still be generated elsewhere and infiltrate email accounts.

Sadly, this year, as last, due to COVID-19 this will not be possible, as the school cannot distribute the gifts to the families. This is a real shame as the gifts are greatly appreciated by the children. This year, as last instead of donating presents, I wonder if we could collect the money normally spent on the presents, in order to provide the children with a Christmas Meal in school before the end of term. If you would like to contribute towards this please put your money in an envelope marked 'St. Joseph's' and pop it through the Presbytery door.

Sacrament of the Sick

And finally:- A few Sundays ago the Newsletter announced that this weekend would be the last upon which the **11.30am** Mass would be celebrated. The addition of the **11.30am** and the **4.30pm** Sunday Masses to our weekend Mass schedule was only ever meant to be temporary, a short-term response to the COVID-19 Pandemic. However, given the high levels of infection and hospitalisation in the Walsall area, and the reintroduction of the Sunday obligation on from Advent Sunday, I have decided to postpone the cessation of the 11.30am Mass until after Christmas. Once Christmas has come and gone I will again review the situation and make a decision regarding this Mass accordingly. So far we are the only Parish in the area to have increased the number of Masses by as many as we did, and are also the only Parish in the Walsall Deanery to have continued with this practice for so long. There will have to come a time when we return to our normal Sunday practice, sustaining this number of Masses is neither practical, nor is it possible.
