

Changes following the easing of the COVID-19 Regulations

As announced at the end of all Masses last weekend there have been significant changes in the way we are now permitted to celebrate Mass. It is, however, not a return to pre-pandemic conditions, we must still be careful and cautious in our approach to these changes. It is of paramount importance that we now, each and every one of us, take on the responsibility of keeping each other safe whilst inside the church building. Whilst there are no social distancing measures in place in the church we must be conscious of leaving spaces, not sitting immediately next to, or behind, other people. Here now are the significant changes:

Track and Trace: We are still required to keep a record, for parish usage only, of those who attend Mass. It is therefore necessary that you use the form on the COVID-19 page (only required once) to book into the Sunday Mass that you will attend regularly. You will then, upon arriving at church, put a tick next to your name on the 'Booking in Form' or alternatively use the QR code which can be scanned via the NHS Track and Trace App on your phone (this you will have indicated on the 'Booking in Form'.

Offertory Gifts: These can now be brought to the altar, from the back of the church, by members of the congregation (at 6pm and 9.30am Masses only). Those bringing up the gifts must use the hand sanitiser on the offertory table before picking up the gifts.

Collections: These can now take place as before lockdown, using the basket system (6pm & 9.30am Masses only). At the 11.30 & 4.30 Masses this will be done as in previous weeks.

Votive Candles: You are now free to light candles at the shrines at the front of the church.

Singing: This will be reintroduced into Mass in September.

Servers: We will reintroduce serving at Mass in September.

Church Cleaners Needed

A new rota will be produced shortly. However since the old rota was suspended, many of our cleaning team members have resigned, to the point where we have less than half of our old volunteers.

If you could find time to help with this important parish activity, please contact Fr. Craig as a matter of urgency.

And finally:- Today, through the Sacred Liturgy, our attention is drawn into the contemplation of the wonderful gift which is the Most Holy Eucharist. Every minute of every day, or as Eucharistic Prayer III put is "from the rising of the sun to its setting", Christ's saving Passion is represented to the Eternal Father for the salvation of souls at every Catholic Mass. Through the Most Holy Eucharist, whereby 'mere men [eat] the bread of Angels', we the consumer of the gift, are drawn to the heart of the Father as we are ourselves consumed by Christ, consumed by life itself. This is the wonder of our faith. This is the gift left to us by Christ in the Eucharist. From every Tabernacle in every Catholic Church, from every Altar where Christ is exposed for adoration, the Lord calls to us 'come to me all you who labour and are over burdened, and I will give you rest'. With thankfulness and praise let us adore the Lord forever.
