And finally:- Each year, on the Second Sunday of Lent, we encounter in our Gospel reading the wonderful scene of the Transfiguration on the top of the mountain. There, in the presence of Peter, James, and John, Christ let His glory be seen. In his meditations on the 'Stations of the Cross' St. Alphonsus de Liguori reminds us that on the day of our Baptism our souls also shone with the glory of God. Sin, however, has darkened and disfigured the image of God that lies at the heart of who we truly are; now the true nature of our souls can be seen only dimly as in a mirror, glimpsed in those moments of grace-filled actions. Lent, and the weapons of 'spiritual combat' - prayer, fasting and almsgiving – strengthen us in our resolve to follow Christ more faithfully day by day. They enable us to overcome the obstacles that block the channels of grace; so that on Easter Sunday, as we celebrate the great victory of Christ over sin and death, we too might once again shine with the glory of God, transfigured in glory by Christ.
