

And finally:- Some graffiti on the toilet wall in a certain Roman University read "Jesus said to them, "Who do you say I am?" They replied, "You are the eschatological manifestation of the ground of our being; the kerygma of which we find the ultimate meaning in our interpersonal relationships." And Jesus said, "What?"" From time to time, during our life of Christian discipleship, it is good to ask ourselves the question "Who do I say that He is?" During our life of faith, and rightly so, our answer to that question will be different because our faith is, or should not be, static. St. Paul writes "When I was a child I spoke like a child, I reasoned like a child... when I became a man I gave up childish ways." Deepening and developing our faith, through reading and catechesis, is an essential part of growing in faith. If our faith development stopped at Confirmation then we are still "reasoning like a child", and we will answer the question posed by the Lord like a child. Deepening our faith, deepening our understanding, deepens our relationship with the Lord.
