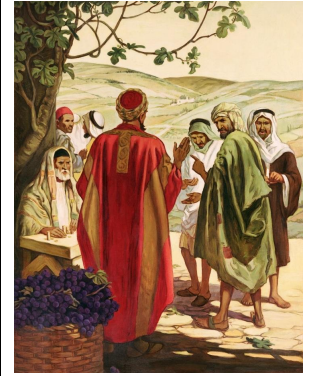

And finally:- This weekend the prophet Isaiah opens the Scriptures with a stark reminder to us all, a reminder that life, and time, are finite. With this in mind he urges us to "Seek the Lord while he is still to be found, call to him while he is still near". In the gospel of today we are then given words of great comfort, words that remind us that it is never too late to respond to the Lord's call. In the gospel we see how the Lord, in His love and mercy, treats all as equals, those who entered His vineyard at daybreak, and those who arrived only at the eleventh hour all received the same wage, the same reward. This, however, is not an excuse to live with the mindset of Oscar Wilde who famously said "I could never live as a Catholic, but I must die as one". He was lucky, a priest came to his bedside only moments before his death and received him into the church. Like Solomon, who asked God to give him a discerning heart, that he might know the ways of the Lord, we too must pray daily to know God's will, and the grace to respond always to His invitation to follow where He leads.

May God bless you all, Fr. Craig
