And finally:- If for Indiana Jones the Ark of the Covenant is merely a lost Biblical artefact, for us it is something much greater. Often movies and tales give the impression that the Ark is something that archaeologists or treasure hunters longed to find as a thing with magical power associated with it. Well, in our case this Ark of the Old Testament pointed to another in the New Testament, to signify the dwelling of God with mankind. What could be more magical than this? Notice how, the boy Samuel was sleeping in the sanctuary where the Ark was; he was in a place where he could hear God's voice. When we come to church – to the Holy Mass and Eucharistic adoration, we too surround ourselves in a place where we hear God personally calling us. The Ark next to which Samuel lied down is a foreshadowing of our Lady, from Whom Jesus Christ, the Word of God came forth in His Humanity; the Ark of the Covenant that utters, although without words – *Behold my Son – the Lamb of God.*
