

If you do not wish to appear on the live-stream please inform one of the stewards who will ensure that you are seated on the left of the church.

And finally:- We begin to understand why the Lord chooses this piece of bread to represent him. Creation, with all of its gifts, aspires above and beyond itself to something even greater. Over and above the synthesis of its own forces, above and beyond the synthesis also of nature and of the spirit that, in some way, we detect in the piece of bread, creation is projected towards divinization, toward the holy wedding feast, towards unification with the Creator himself. And still, we have not yet explained in death the message of this sign of bread. The Lord mentioned its deepest mystery on Palm Sunday, when some Greeks asked to see him. In his answer to this question is the phrase: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit". The mystery of the Passion is hidden in the bread made of ground wheat. Flour, the ground wheat, presupposes the death and resurrection of the grain. Only through death does resurrection arrive, as does the fruit of new life. (Benedict XVI)
